Please ensure that all works have adequate means of hanging and that frames and mounts are undamaged. The preferred hanging method is attached cord or wire. Any works not meeting these standards will not be hung.

Please COLLECT old works from the gallery back room as soon as possible.





Forbes Heritage

The Forbes Heritage Award night was held at the Platypus Gallery on Tuesday 7 May 2019. The Forbes Medal was awarded, as well as the Heritage Art Prizes – theme 'Public Buildings'. As well, the inaugural Forbes Heritage Young Artist Scholarship, jointly funded by Forbes Shire Council and Forbes Arts Society was awarded to Fletcher Browne and Jenna Redfern who received \$500 each. Fletcher and Jenna's art form is dance.

The Forbes Medal was awarded to the *Forbes Post Office* restoration project. Other nominations included *Carrawobitty* restoration, the exhibition *Heroes, Horses and Hardships* and *Buried at Sea* a oneman theatrical production.

Sampa Bhakta was awarded the \$500 Forbes Shire Council Acquisition Prize. Sampa was also awarded First Prize in Painting and Drawing. Pammie Thomson was awarded Second Prize in Drawing. Ro Burns was awarded First Prize in Photography and Karen Ritchie was awarded Second Prize in Painting and Photography.

ART ASPECTS

ROBYN COLLIER is a well-known traditional landscape artist who paints mainly in oils. In her latest newsletter (May/June 2019) she offers these common composition mistakes to avoid:

- Avoid too much happening without leaving an area for the eye to rest – we seem to want to fill even the smallest space.
- Avoid objects of equal shape and distance very common error
- Avoid including weirdly shaped objects unless necessary to the painting – just because it is there doesn't mean you have to include it.
- Avoid a crooked horizon.
- Avoid hard edges that don't belong.
- Avoid placing an object in the middle of the painting.
- Avoid anything that doesn't add to or benefit your painting.
